#### **Heinsburg School Presentation**

A delegation of staff and students from Heinsburg School presented their learning using VEX robots, demonstrating how they have coded the robots to perform specific tasks and follow directions. This is the school's first year working with VEX coding and robotics systems. We look forward to seeing the program grow as students continue to build their skills in this area!

#### 2026-27 School Learning Calendar

Trustees approved Calendar B of the 2026-27 School Learning Calendar, along with a separate version for the Two Hills Mennonite and Colony schools. The calendar includes a week-long Fall Break, with the school year starting on August 31, 2026. Both calendars are now available on the Division website, allowing families to plan ahead for the next two school years.

#### Saddle Lake Trustee Invitation

The Board will follow up with Saddle Lake Cree Nation regarding the invitation to submit a nomination to fill the FNMI trustee position, with the goal of a trustee commencing following the October general election.

#### Science Fair

Eighteen students from St. Paul Education participated in the 2025 Lakeland Regional Science Fair on April 12. Congratulations to Ryan Noel from Ecole Racette School and Harper Matthews and Shyanne Klatt from New Myrnam School, who qualified for the Canada-Wide Science Fair in Fredericton in June. We wish them all the best!

#### **Excellence in Catholic Education Award**

Congratulations to Ginette Plante, a teacher at Ecole St. Paul Elementary School, for being the recipient of this award. The award was presented at the annual Sharing Purpose in Catholic Education (SPICE) conference in Kananaskis at the beginning of May.

#### **Election Bylaw**

Trustees passed the first reading of a bylaw to adopt a modified voting procedure under the Local Authorities Election Act. This would allow the Returning Officer to designate multiple voting stations per subdivision and align election logistics, such as locations and hours, with local municipalities. The Bylaw will come into full effect upon the third and final reading by June 30.

#### **Summer School**

Registration is now open for the Division's Summer School Program, which will run from July 2 to 29. This is a great opportunity for students to complete a course before the new school year begins, retake a class, or upgrade their marks. A variety of courses are available, including Google Productivity Pro, where students will receive a new Chromebook upon completion. The program also offers several dual credit courses that allow students to earn college credit. For more information, visit the Division website.



#### Mental Health & Counselling Supports

Bridget Severin, Division Counselling and Communications Coordinator, presented an overview of the Division's mental health and counselling supports. The Family School Liaison Worker (FSLW) program provides supportive informal individual counselling to students. The Together Were Better Mental Health Capacity Building Program, a provincially funded initiative, promotes mental health in schools and communities through universal and targeted programming. The Integrated Student Support Program, funded through an external research grant, focuses on mental health, nutrition, and physical education supports at Ecole St. Paul Elementary School.

Thank you to all partners who contribute financially to these supports, including our local Family School Liaison Worker program municipal sponsors: the County of St. Paul, Town of St. Paul, County of Two Hills, and Town of Two Hills FCSS.



#### **Financial Report**

The Division has received its funding profile for the upcoming school year, which includes a new mental health grant of \$148,000 to support student wellness initiatives. A budget planning review meeting is scheduled for May 28.


